## FROM THE MINISTER'S DESK

Please support our newly forming Youth Group-UUnited.

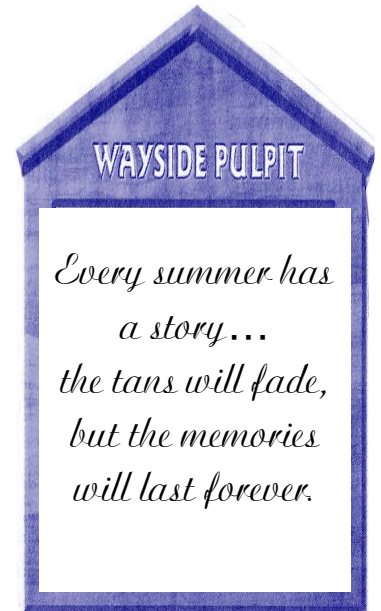
UUnited is a Regional Youth Group of eight local area congregations. Our goal is to inspire youth to experience the awesome potential of love which lies at the center of our faith. The money raised will be used to fund a Youth Group Coordinator who will plan activities, communicate with families and churches, administer the program and work with the youth to identify and develop leadership. The more than 50 youth expected from the eight congregations will create worship, engage in service projects, teach and learn from each other, play, and break bread together. They will meet twice a month at First Parish Church in Taunton MA. UUnited is grounded in our individual UU congregations and designed to deepen relationships beyond those congregations.

At our General Assembly this year, we kicked off a FAITHIFY fundraising project to make UUNited a reality. We need to raise \$15000 for our youth group to be successful. We are currently tuned to 25% and have only about 50 days to raise the rest. (Like Kickstarter, we must raise the full amount to get any funds.)

## WORSHIP THEMES FOR THE YEAR

### SUMMER SERVICES:

#### **July 6– Annual Jazz Service**

#### **"Lyceum Series" Begins**

This summer's format will be different from our usual Sunday services. Each week will feature a speaker from the congregation or community who will answer questions after a half hour talk on an interesting topic. July's theme is local history.

#### **July 13- Bob Maker - *A History of The New Bedford Lyceum***

This first talk will be a history of the New Bedford Lyceum and its many connections to the Unitarian Church.

#### **July 20- Fred Gifun - *Bulletin from the 1800s: Quakers Quietly Transform the First Congregational Society in New Bedford.***

Dr. Gifun's talk is based on his history of this congregation, and will feature the influence of the Quakers in its ecclesiastical evolution.

#### **July 27- Mary Rapoza - *The Park Movement in New Bedford***

Mid 19th Century saw a nation wide movement to enhance the physical and emotional health of urban populations with the development of park lands. New Bedford was an early adherent to the movement developing a system of city parks enjoyed to this day.
