

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### PAUL BUNYAN BURGERS FOR FATHER'S DAY BBQ

#### **Ingredients**

6 bacon strips, diced
1 cup sliced fresh
mushrooms
3 thin onion slices
1 egg, lightly beaten
1 tablespoon
Worcestershire sauce
1/2 tspn seasoned salt
1/2 tspn salt
1/2 tspn pepper
1/2 tspn prepared
horseradish
1 lb ground beef

3 slices American cheese

3 hamburger buns, split

#### **Directions**

Cook bacon until crisp. Remove with a slotted spoon to paper towels. In the drippings, sauté mushrooms and onion until tender. Transfer to a large bowl with a slotted spoon: add bacon. In another bowl, combine the egg, Worcestershire sauce, seasoned salt, salt, pepper and horseradish; sprinkle beef over mixture and mix well. Shape into six 1/4-in.-thick patties. Divide bacon mixture among three patties. Top with a cheese slice; fold in corners of cheese. Top with remaining patties; seal edges. Grill, uncovered, over medium-hot heat until meat juices run clear.

Serve on buns.

## FROM THE TRUSTEES

At their meeting on May 14, the Trustees voted three final changes to the church's annual budget for Fiscal Year 2014, all of which were approved by the congregation, along with the full budget, at the annual meeting on May 19:

- 1. The amount for monthly guest musicians, to play during Randy's monthly week off, was raised from \$2,000 to \$2,750 for ten services during the church year (September-June). (The higher amount had already been included in the budget printed in the annual meeting booklet.)
- 2. Under PROGRAM ACTIVITIES, \$250 was included for baby-sitting services during special program events, such as the new member orientation sessions, etc.
- 3. Under OUTREACH, a new line item of \$1,000 was added as a contingency fund for the church as a possible contribution to a consortium of historical churches in New Bedford.

The consortium of historic New Bedford churches, if formed, will be part of the historic churches/sacred places effort that was begun earlier this year under the sponsorship of the New Bedford Preservation Society, the Historic Preservation Education Foundation, and Partners for Sacred Places. Two related workshops under this sponsorship were convened at Grace Episcopal Church by the City of New Bedford, the Inter-Church Council of Greater New Bedford, the New Bedford Whaling National Historic Park, and the Waterfront Historic Area LEague (WHALE). The purpose of the proposed consortium is to engage the non-profit Partners for Sacred Places in a year-long training program for consortium members to help promote financial and religious sustainability for congregations through stronger ties to their communities. Representatives of First Unitarian will attend a follow-up workshop on this topic on June 4<sup>th</sup> with representatives from other area churches. Partners for Sacred Spaces will once again present their program and proposal for New Bedford, which will be considered for adoption at the meeting.

The Board continued its discussion of the relationship between the church's endowment and stewardship by members through pledging and fundraising. Although an improving economy and surging stock market have helped ease current pressure on the endowment, the annual draw of about 11% to help support the programs and maintenance of the church is still unsustainable over the long term. More support will need to come from pledges and fundraising, both out of fiscal necessity, and for what it will mean for the ability of the church to fulfill its mission to members and the community. The Trustees expressed confidence in the growth and long-term viability of this congregation, given current trends, enthusiasm, and

#### activities.

Two examples of this increased activity are the children's RE program and the process and findings of the Social Justice Committee. Registration in the RE program reached 25 this year, with increased parental involvement in Sunday services and church-related events. Adult education is another area of growth and increased activity, thanks to programs initiated by Rev. Paul and others. The Social Justice Committee reported to the Board in May, and indicated that it would present two of the three top projects that emerged from the house meetings held during the church year: one project outlined a cooperative program with an under-performing New Bedford school, and another focused on art as an instrument of self-realization and social justice.






